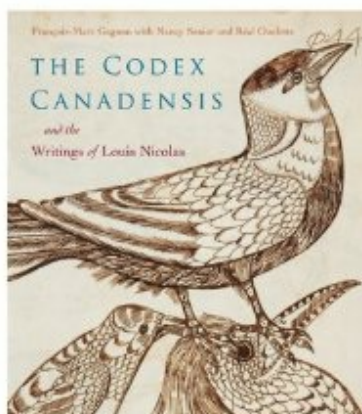

Francois-Marc Gagnon, director and chair of the Gail and Stephen A. Jarislowsky Institute for Studies in Canadian Art, will discuss a new book of the annotated English translation for Louis Nicolas' text *Histoire Naturelle des Indes Occidentales* that includes a modern French translation of the original work. Nicolas titled his text the *Natural History of the West Indies* because that is what he thought North America was. Full color illustrations from the Gilcrease *Codex Canadensis* will be included. The original 79-page document, written circa 1700, describes the First Nations, plants, mammals, birds and fish of Canada. This new natural history narrative, which draws from experts in varying fields from linguistics to biology and botany, speaks in detail about many of the plants and animals seen in the *Codex* illustrations. A book signing follows the talk.

It is traditionally served at parties celebrating weddings and baptisms in France.
